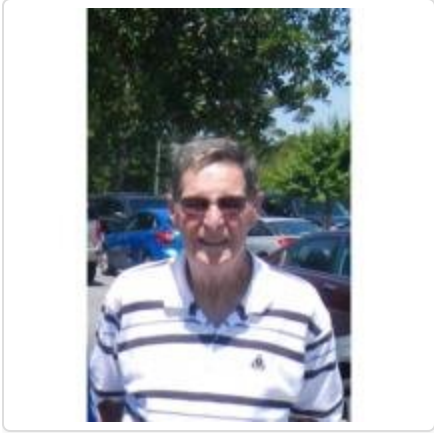




Charles Mickey Adair
