December 15, 1914 - September 25, 2012

On September 25, 2012, Mother answered the call of God and found her place of rest.

Mother Eloise Wilson Flagg was born to the late Daniel and Fannie J. Wilson on December 15, 1914. She was the eldest of three children and was preceded in death by her two brothers, Daniel Wilson, II and Calvin Wilson.

This Savannah native accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior and was Baptized at Second African Baptist Church at an early age under the Pastorate of the Rev. Edgar Perry Quarterman. Mother Flagg received her Bachelor of Science degree from Savannah State College (now University). She also did advance studies and received her Master's Degree from Atlanta University.

She married Joseph H. Flagg, who preceded her in death, and moved to Screven County where she served over thirty years at Central High School as a teacher and a counselor. There in Screven County, she joined the St. Paul Baptist Church where she rendered many years of dedicated service. Mother Flagg was a member of several community and civic organizations and was a faithful member of Alpha Gamma Chi Sorority Inc.
